LOCATION

We'll be based at the La Selva Biological Field Station, which lies at the confluence of two major rivers in the Caribbean lowlands of northern Costa Rica. It encompasses 3,900 acres of tropical rainforest made accessible via a network of bike paths and walking trails. The La Selva Research Station hosts over 400 bird species, 1,000's of arthropods, amphibians, reptiles, large predators such as pumas and jaguars, and a myriad of fascinating plants.
